WISCONSIN FORWARD TEST

Students in grades 3-8 will take the Wisconsin Forward Exam starting the week of March 20; the test will be taken statewide on computers. This state assessment will be used to gauge how well students are mastering the Wisconsin College and Career Ready standards in English language arts (ELA) in mathematics; 4th grade students will also complete Social Studies and Science portions. The exam includes multiple-choice questions, short answer questions, and performance tasks. Accommodations and supports for students with disabilities and or English language learners are built into the system so that the progress of students can be accurately measured. This test is extremely important to our school and to our district - please work with us to encourage your child to do his/her best.

MAP Testing

Students in grades 2-5 will complete their spring MAP test starting the last week of April. This is the last MAP test for this year (we test in fall, winter, and spring); achievement printouts outlining student growth will be sent home with 4th quarter progress reports.

Roosevelt Reading Resolution

For our new year's resolution, Roosevelt is working hard to read one million minutes by the end of May! Each month (January through May), reading calendars will be sent home in Wednesday folders so that students are able to track their daily reading. Each month that a completed calendar is returned, students will earn a special treat from area businesses such as Culvers, Olivers, Chilis, and even a ticket to Great America (in conjunction with Read to Succeed). Please encourage your child to read each day, and support Roosevelt in its resolution to read one million minutes by May!

4K and KINDERGARTEN ONLINE REGISTRATION

Online registration will begin on April 26. Please complete the necessary form online and bring into the office your child's birth certificate, immunization records, and proof of residency-lease agreement, mortgage statement, or electric bill.

SIXTH GRADE SUMMER SCHOOL

Summer school students who are in fifth grade this year will go to the middle school they will attend next year for their summer school. This will allow them to become familiar with their next school at the same time they are being prepared academically for 6th grade. More information and specific schedules will be available when the summer school brochure is printed. When the brochures arrive, we will be sending them home.

SUMMER SCHOOL AT BRASS

Summer school will be held at Brass again this year. Dates are June 19 – July 24. Teachers will examine test scores, common assessments and unit tests in reading and math to determine which students need to attend. Special education students who are not performing at grade level are also expected to attend summer school.
