CLASS LISTS FOR 2017-2018

The teachers and I will begin the process of forming class lists for the 2017-2018 school year. Teachers will use their knowledge of your student to create classroom placements that ensure balance for optimal teaching and learning. We invite you to share your thoughts about your student's needs with his or her teacher; however, we ask that you do not request a specific teacher.

The current classroom teachers, in consultation with the principal, will be responsible for determining class lists for next year, using the following guidelines:

- Parent's perceptions of their child's learning style and individual needs
- Student's level of academic achievement
- Student's behavior
- Number of boys and girls in a classroom
- Number of students requiring special education or other modifications in a classroom
- Students requiring special health consideration
- Interactions between specific students – positive or not-so-positive

Consideration of all these factors will yield class lists. The final decision on all placements rests with the principal.
